
A BIRD OF THE AIR



ECCLESIASTES 10:20

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WINGS OF PROPHECY

This leaflet explains the purpose and work of the aviation program, which is a prophetic work supported by the prophecies of the Bible. John described in Revelation 14:6 how the last days gospel was to reach every creature through the assistance of a flying program. "And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people." We notice in this same chapter that this angel was followed by two other angels. The first one declared the plan of salvation; the second one declared that Babylon had fallen which shows that church confusion had ceased and all men had been made to see; the third one told of the antichrist and warned the people not to take the mark of the beast. This aviation program supports these three texts.

The writer of Ecclesiastes explained it somewhat clearer than the writings of John. Angels were not permitted to preach the gospel, but they were made ministering spirits and, of course, they are used to minister in a flying program of prophecy. "Curse not the king, no not in thy thought; and curse not the rich in thy bedchamber: for a bird of the air shall carry the voice (the preacher), and that which hath wings shall tell the matter." Ecclesiastes 10:20. A bird of the air is something that has wings to fly and

the voice is someone that speaks with vocal organs. The word "matter" here means that which is spoken or written. Kings, governors and rich men have developed aviation for God for the purpose of fulfilling His Word.

The prophet Isaiah described the airplanes in his prophecy as we see them in this present age. "Who are these that fly as a cloud, and as the doves to their windows?" Isaiah 60:8. "These" spoken of in this verse means people flying in the elements, and "cloud" means airplanes flying through the sky as clouds and carrying people to their destination. As a dove would be seen at his resting place looking out of his little window, so are these people seen as a little dove looking out of the little windows of the airplanes.

The prophet Ezekiel described them as living creatures because they moved on the ground and in the air under their own power. He described some of them as having overhead wings with wheels on them and seats in them for people to sit on and a sound as of a mighty rushing as they lift up from the ground going to the firmament. Then he described some of them as having folding wings and they fold their wings after they land. Ezekiel saw his group of planes in a gospel program spreading the last days message and being directed from the throne of heaven by the righteous man. "Then I looked, and, behold, in the firmament that was above the head of the cherubims there appeared over them as it were a sapphire stone, as the appearance of the likeness of a throne. And he spake unto the man clothed with linen, and said, Go in between the wheels, even under the cherub, and fill thine hand with coals of fire from between the cherubims, and scatter them over the city. And he went in in my sight." Ezekiel 10:1, 2.

Jesus was not the first man to ride a donkey and He was not the last one, but He was the first man to outline and put on a prophecy program by riding a little donkey. These are not the first airplanes to be flown or ridden in, but this is the first gospel aviation program that has been put on by the Church in fulfillment of prophecy as it is outlined in the Bible.

Ezekiel described it in the way it is seen operating today. The righteous man gets in under the wings and sits down between the wheels and fills his hands full of coals of fire which is the gospel, the Word of the Lord. Then the man was told to scatter it over the cities. There is no other way to do this other than by the use of the airplane. Ezekiel said that he did it in his sight. This type of airplane is used as a flying marker for the purpose of flying over cities and scattering literature, gospel tracts and flying saucers that contain gospel messages of printed matter.

God said through Moses that these things would come to pass in the last days and it is to be done by the true Church, the Church of Prophecy. He declared, "Give ear, O ye heavens, and I will speak; and hear, O earth, the words of my mouth." The words of His mouth are to be put in print also for He said in the second verse, "My doctrine shall drop as the rain, my speech shall distil as the dew, as the small rain upon the tender herb, and as the showers upon the grass." It would be necessary to use airplanes to fulfill this Scripture since the third verse supports the fact that it is the published message in written form. "Because I will publish the name of the Lord: ascribe ye greatness unto our God." Deuteronomy 32:3. To publish means to make known; to put in print. In Isaiah 40:31 it is written, "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint." They that serve the Lord shall be strengthened by the use of the program of wings in connection with the spread of the gospel. It shall be proclaimed from the air, in the air and on the ground to the inhabitants of the world.



The above picture shows how Wings of Prophecy is presented to whole cities at a time; radio broadcast, on the street with loud-speakers, airplanes in the air, with thousands of gospel tracts glittering in the sky as they are tossed from the planes. This particular program was at Cordele, Georgia.

When prophecy is fulfilled it is then used to identify and to manifest the divine program of God. For example, the airplane program, which has been used according to prophecy, is a fulfillment of the Scriptures. That which has fulfilled prophecy becomes the voice of God and in the case of the airplane, it points out the true Church, the divine body of Jesus Christ to the people. It was through this method that Jesus identified Himself from all other good men and from people who tried to rob Him of His title and glory. He proved by His works of fulfilling prophecy that He was the true Messiah and that He was here in the volume of the book that was written of Him: "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures (those He fulfilled) the things concerning himself." Luke 24:27. Words prove what is right and the right will reveal the wrong. Jesus made another statement to make it a little clearer in John 5:36: "But I have greater witness than that of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me." It was through this principle that the New Testament was made, and the New Testament reveals the fact that there is only one Church.

To this one divine Church which was identified by the law and prophets, God reveals all of His works. The works of God are not enforced by the law but they are operated by the Spirit and witnessed by the law and prophets according to Paul's letter to the Roman church: "But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested, being witnessed by the law and the prophets." Romans 3:21.

This airplane program is only one of the witnesses confirmed by the law and the prophets which point out the true Church. It is a very simple program which is not operated with the large aircraft at the present, but it fits the Scripture and this is all that is necessary: ". . .for a bird of the air shall carry the voice, and that which hath wings shall tell the matter."

The writer of Hebrews declared in his writings that the law has made a type and shadow of good things to come and, of course, these things are to be witnessed by the law and the prophets. This leaflet explains this well: "For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect." Hebrews 10:1. The church that does the things that fulfills prophecy is the true Church.

There is only one thing that can keep a man from seeing the divine program of prophecy and that is the same thing that kept Israel from seeing the Christ of prophecy and the Church of prophecy—a veil is upon their minds and hearts and they can't understand types and shadows: "But their minds were blinded: for until this day remaineth the same vail untaken away in the reading of the old testament; which vail is done away in Christ. But even unto this day, when Moses is read, the vail is upon their heart." 2 Corinthians 3:14, 15. This same veil is not only upon the Jews but has threatened the Gentile nations; however, it is to be lifted from the nations and all men will be made to see the true Church as Christ declared in John 10:16: "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd." Remember, the voice of God as He speaks to man today is the fulfillment of prophecy.

It is an evident fact that the New Testament Church did not finish the program. If it had been finished then, the world would have come to an end. But since they did not finish, God again has raised up His Church to finish the fulfillment of His Word as it is written in Ephesians 1:22, 23: "And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all." To the person who reads this leaflet, the Spirit has said, "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches. . ."

The name, Church of God of Prophecy, is used for the sole purpose of designating the true church as outlined by Scripture.
