Let Us Rise Up and Build

These were the words of Nehemiah in the second chapter and the seventeenth verse. Nehemiah had heard the report of how the brethren had neglected the holy city to the extent that the walls were fallen down and gates were burned and much of the city laid in waste. Only a rim was left in Jerusalem, of which, was reproach and this was more than the Prophet Nehemiah could stand, so he said, 'Let us build,' or let us rebuild the walls, the gates, and all that was needed to bring the city back to its original state. In the 19th verse of the second chapter and I quote, 'Then I told them of the hand of my God which was good upon me; as also the Kings words that he had spoken unto me. And they said, Let us rise up and build. So they strengthened their hands for the good work.' We are able to do this even as Nehemiah and his co-workers rebuilt the waste of Jerusalem. Perhaps the twentieth verse of the second chapter of Nehemiah will give, in better words, what I am calling for in the face of our persecutions. "Then answered I them, and said unto them, the God of heaven, he will prosper us, therefore, we his servants will arise and build: but ye have no portion, nor right, nor memorial, in Jerusalem." This verse is the answer to those who might not believe that we will do the work in spite of persecution. And true to the Scriptures, they will have no part in this great memorial...the reforming and rebuilding of all things.
